Russian wins piano competition

Denis Evstuhin, 27, of Russia was declared the winner of the 2009 Iowa Piano Competition and won \$7,500 Saturday night at the Orpheum Theater in Sioux City.

Second place and a \$2,750 prize went to Dmitri Vorobiev, 35, also of Russia.

Third place and a \$1,500 prize went to Ryo Yanagitani, 30, of Canada.

"It wasn't a clear cut decision. They (the judges) were in there for a while going over all the aspects of the competition and came up with a decision," Trinette Patterson of the Sioux City Symphony said. "It was very close. Their abilities were very close to one another. It was tough for them to pick one out," she said.

Approximately 90 people from across the globe applied to be part of the competition. A panel selected a field of 12, who were invited to Sioux City to perform.
